HISTORY

Founded in 1987 originally as In the Company of Dancers, and merging into Of Moving Colors Productions (OMC) in 1998, OMC has been a strong dance presence in Baton Rouge for 25 years. OMC offers the general public 2-3 full-scale contemporary dance theatre productions annually. Aside from major productions, we operate an extensive community outreach program entitled "CLOSER to the Arts." These activities include smaller community performances, educational outreaches, workshops, art exhibitions, lectures, and modern dance classes open to the dance community. OMC is a frequent collaborator with other community organizations. We reach between 15,000 and 30,000 children and adults annually and have performed in well over 100 venues.

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

A native of Louisiana, Wilson studied dance, voice and theatre through college. She additionally trained at festivals and residencies with ImpulsTanz (Vienna), the Jose Limon Institute (NYC), Dance Theatre Workshop (NCY) and others. She spent nearly a decade touring extensively through Asia and Eastern Europe with companies including Windows, TNZNT, and others. She returned to Louisiana in 1996 and took over the Directorship in 1997. In her fifteen years with the company, she has created over 35 full length works, worked in literally hundreds of educational venues, and served as Guest Instructor/ Choreographer at Louisiana State University, Belhaven University, and many local schools.

Garland has hosted residencies by world-class artists such as Netta Yerushalmy, Ashleigh Leite, Pavel Zustiak, Joe Alegado, Hannah Kahn, Stephen Wynne, and Emily Plauche-Flink. She has collaborated with numerous organizations and served as a grants panelist for the Louisiana Division of the Arts and the GBR Arts Council.

She co-founded the Louisiana Alliance for Dance and the Louisiana Dance Festival.
